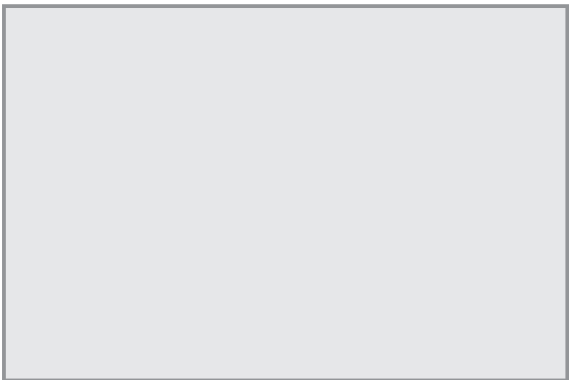


Figure 1: This is an example for a single column figure with a longer caption to test the line height and font size in relation to the text of the paper.

Equations should be centered within one column and labeled in the following manner:

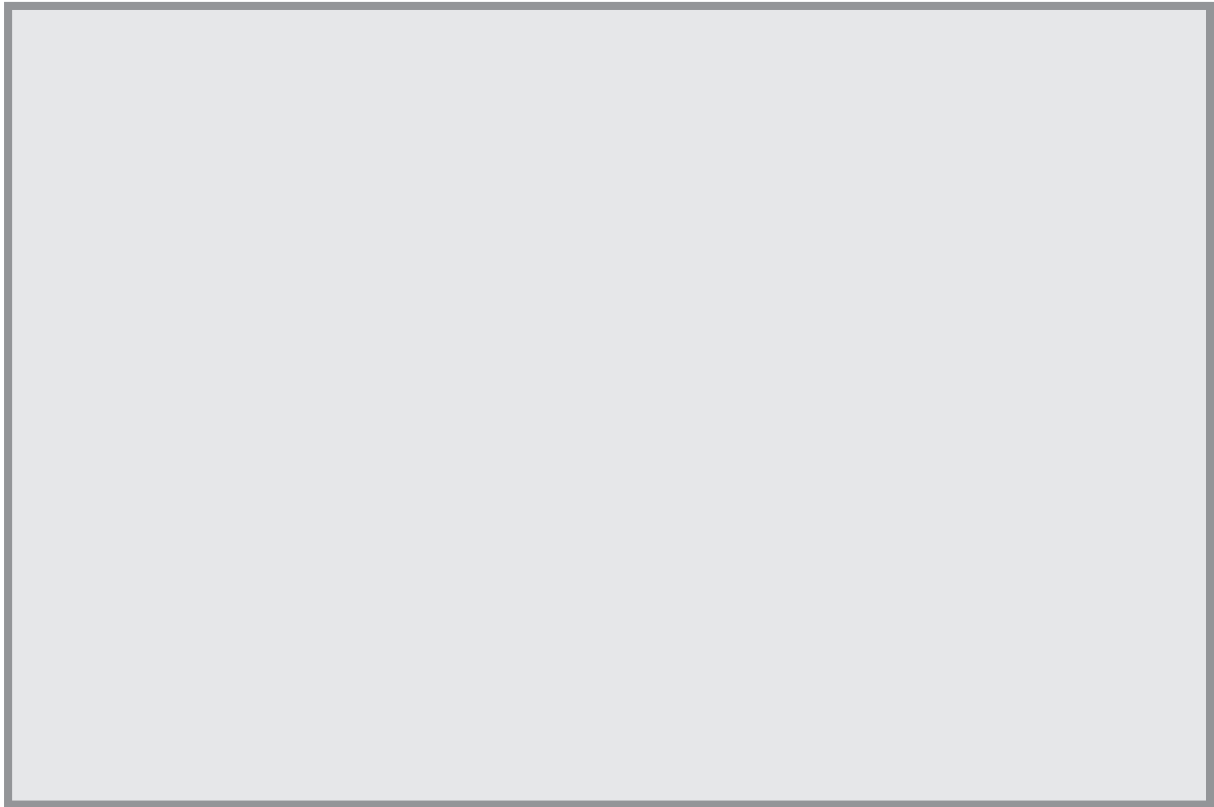
